

AT&T Offers New Mobile Medical Imaging Service

On the heels of <u>AT&T</u>s' partnerships with mobile health companies <u>WellDoc</u>, <u>Vitality and MedApps</u> comes a new cloud-based offering: AT&T Medical Imaging and Information Management Service.

The company has signed an agreement to offer the service through <u>Baptist Health System</u> and <u>Henry Ford Health System</u>. The service will enable doctors to access patients' medical images on mobile devices from any device the image was originally taken from.

"With the AT&T solution, which uses the power of our network combined with digital imaging technology, doctors and other healthcare providers can transform the way they treat patients," said Randall Porter, assistant vice president of <u>AT&T ForHealth</u>.

One of the largest healthcare systems in Alabama, Baptist Health System has more than 2 million images and 30,000 new images per month, which accumulates to 350,000 images annually. According to Cloud News Daily, the Henry Ford Health System plans to use AT&T's service to store new and existing cardiology imaging studies.
