FDA Regulation of Mobile Health, State of Wireless Health Industry among Popular Themes Explored at 2nd Annual Digital Health Summit

He is joined by Dr. Anand Iyer, President and COO of WellDoc, and executives from GreatCall and AT&T, as panelists on *The Doctor in Your Hand: Exploring Mobile Health Options*, a session moderated by MobiHealth News' Brian Dolan, which will discuss m-health demand and the other side of the coin, including regulation, who's paying, and whether or not devices are delivering what they promise.
